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Kids Art & Music Classes

We have been pursuing our mission of working with the community by providing free art and music classes for kids during summer and after school. Last year, we received a grant from the OHA Adolescent & School Health program, which helped us bring talented pianist Laura Mass, guitarist Evyn Witton, and high school students on board to participate in the kids' summer music camps. Furthermore, Evyn continued with our after-school music program, teaching Ukulele and guitar classes to children aged between 9 and 13 years old in a six-week course, in which we had 15 participants.



This year, we have the wonderful opportunity to continue working with the OHA Adolescent & School Health program grant, and we are excited to launch our kids' Art classes for spring and summer with our local artists and high school students!

We are excited to announce that we launched a Music and Art class for adults last year based on the community's interest. Our art classes were taught by the talented Rosamaria Rosales, who covered a variety of art techniques such as charcoal, watercolors, and collage. The response from the community was overwhelming as the classes were informative and therapeutic for participants after a long day of work.

We are proud to report that our recent introduction of a range of Adult classes has been a great success.

Among the most popular courses was the six-week guitar lessons program taught by Evyn Witton. Students gained invaluable knowledge about music theory and received hands-on training to improve their guitar-playing skills.

Additionally, our sewing art studio welcomed an exceptional instructor who led a three-week course on the art of hexagon hand stitching. This workshop was a hit among participants as they learned a new technique they had never encountered before.

We are thrilled to continue offering Adult classes this year and hope to welcome even more participants.
